1. Which New Zealand Olympic Gold Medalist was introduced to Adolf Hitler?

A. Jack Lovelock, 1936 Berlin Olympics after he (Jack not Adolf) won the 1500m in a new world record time.

2. In what year did Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay reach the top of Everest?

A. 1953 (29th May – four days after the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II).

3. What is Helen Clarke's new job?

A. Head of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with a budget of USD 13 billion and operating in 166 countries. This is the number 3 job at the UN after the Secretary-General (Ban Ki-moon) and his Deputy.

4. Who is currently the Governor General? (You must spell his names correctly!)

A. The Governor-General, Hon Sir Anand Satyanand, is the personal representative of New Zealand's Head of State, Queen Elizabeth II of New Zealand.

5. What building in Wellington was recently opened by HRH Prince William?

Supreme Court on 18th January 2010.

6. Which band brought 92 container loads of equipment to play two shows at Wellington's Westpac Stadium and a show in Auckland in Feb 2010?

AC-DC (and they started with Runaway Train' off their new Black Ice recording).

7. What is the current Reserve Bank OCR rate?

A. 2.5% (and it has been since 30th April 2009).

8. According to Statistics New Zealand's population clock, what was the estimated resident population of New Zealand at 3.00pm on Tuesday 2nd February 2010?

A. 4,353,567

9. What was the median weekly income in the June 2009 quarter (the latest figures available from Statistics New Zealand)?

A. \$538.

- 10. According to the 2001 National census, what is New Zealand's second largest ethnic group (after 'New Zealand European' at 2,689,308)?
- A. Maori with 526,281
- 11. What is New Zealand's second largest export for the year ended June 2009 after dairy at 21.1% (\$9.1 billion)?
- A. Meat 12.8%, then wood (not wool!) at 5.4%
- 12. Who is currently New Zealand's Minister for Small Business?

Hon. Maurice Williamson, MP for Pakuranga since 1987.

- 13. What percentage "of adults have literacy and numeracy skills below those needed to participate fully in a knowledge society. Over 80% are in the workforce."
- A. 43% according to the Adult Literacy and Life Skills Survey 2006.
- 14. Who is likely to be New Zealand's first Saint?

Mary Joseph Aubert (Suzanne) known as 'Mother Aubert' (1835-1926), Catholic nun, nurse, herbalist, teacher, social worker, and write. Started a home for orphans and the under-privileged in Jerusalem, New Zealand on the Whanganui River in 1885. She founded a religious order, the Daughters of Our Lady of Compassion in 1892. She later started two hospitals in Wellington; the first, St Joseph's Home for Incurables in 1900, and Our Lady's Home of Compassion in 1907.'

15. Where and on what date will the opening game of the 2011 Rugby World Cup take place? (Two points)

Eden Park, Auckland, Friday 9th September 2011, New Zealand v. Tonga
